#### ELIGIBILITY

All artists 18 and older are invited to participate. Framed 2-dimensional work in any media including photography and 3-dimensional work will be accepted. All work must be original and not previously displayed in the HCAC Fall Fine Arts Show. Framed work must be dry and wired for hanging. (No saw tooth hangers please). #### FEES

HCAC members up to 3 pieces for \$20. Non-members up to 3 pieces for \$25. Make checks payable to Hampshire County Arts Council. 15% commission to HCAC from all works sold.

#### APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Hand delivered works only. Complete an identification tag for each piece and attach it to the back of the work. Complete an artist file card. Present the file card, payment and work to the registration desk at the Bank of Romney Community Center At the designated times. Artists are encouraged to submit a brief biography detailing their interests and work.

 age to the work or property of entrants.

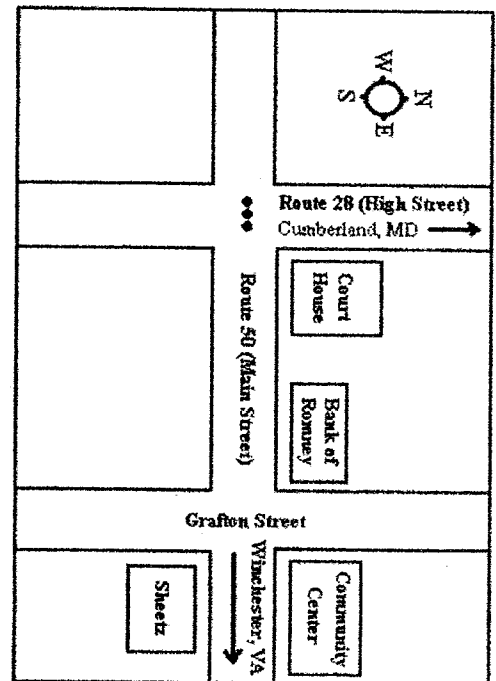
## LOCATION

 east of stoplight at Rt. 50/Rt. 28) Look for signs a

From Washington/Winchester: Take Rt. 50 West

From Cumberland, MD: Take Rt. 28 South to  
 Romney (30 miles).

From Elkins/Petersburg/Moorefield: Take Rt. 220  
 North to Rt. 50, turn east to Romney.

Again this year, artists are encouraged to bring a portfolio of their prints and photographs. An area has been set aside for displaying the portfolios. All prints and photographs should be matted and covered with a protective see-through sleeve. Each print/photograph should have a label on the back containing the artist's name, the title of the work and the price. Also, each artist should bring two copies of a list of all their prints/photographs, their titles and cost. One copy will remain with the portfolio and one copy will be held at the desk. Artist's are also responsible for providing a display rack for their prints/photographs. There will be a 15% commission on all works sold.

As was the case last year, we are limiting the number of portfolios to 10.
